The best-looking of the group, Sonne, succeeds, and Victoria to drop her prior plans to drink with them on a nearby rooftop. Summer in a village in Northern Turkey, five free-spirited teenaged sisters splash about on the beach with their male classmates. Though their games are innocent fun, a neighbour reports what she considers to be illicit behavior to the girls' family. The family overreacts, removing "instruments of corruption," such as phones and computers, and essentially imprisoning the girls, subjecting them to endless lessons in housework in preparation for them to become brides. *1hr 37 mins. Bridge Of Spies

Bridge Of Spies is inspired by the true story of an insurance lawyer, James B. Donovan, who became the unlikely go-between between the U.S. and Soviet governments in 1957. Donovan is nominated as arrested Soviet spy, Abel's defence lawyer following his capture, who makes a convincing case to have Abel imprisoned rather than executed, in case he's ever needed as a bargaining chip. That need arises almost instantly. *2hr 22 mins. Stars: Tom Hanks, Mark Rylance, Alan Alda*

The ASSF awards recognise outstanding talent in filmmaking practice, and are a prestigious accolade, selected by a jury of industry experts. This is a selection of the winning films. Krigen (original title) Company commander Claus M. Pedersen and his men are stationed in an Afghan province. Meanwhile back in Denmark Claus's wife, Maria is trying to hold everyday life together with a husband at war and three children missing their father. During a routine mission, the soldiers are caught in heavy crossfire and in order to save his men, Claus makes a decision that has grave consequences for him – and his family back home. *1hr 55min Stars: Alex Høgh Andersen, Pilou Asbæk, Tuva Novotny*

Eye in the Sky follows Colonel Katherine Powell, a UK-based military officer in command of a top secret drone operation to capture terrorists in Kenya. Powell discovers the targets are planning a suicide bombing and the mission escalates from "capture" to "kill." But as American pilot Steve Watts is about to engage, a nine-year-old girl enters the kill zone triggering an international dispute, reaching the highest levels of American and British government. *1h 42 min, Stars: Helen Mirren, Aaron Paul, Alan Rickman*

Umimachi Diary (original title) Three sisters Sachi, Yoshino and Chika live together in a large house in the city of Kamakura. When their father absent from the family home for the last 15 years dies, they travel to the countryside for his funeral and meet their shy teenage half-sister. Bonding quickly with the orphaned Suzu, they invite her to live with them. Suzu eagerly agrees, and a new life of joyful discovery begins for the four siblings. *2 hr 08 mins. Stars: Haruka Ayase, Masami Nagasawa, Kaho*

Macbeth is the story of a fearless warrior and inspiring leader brought low by ambition and desire. A thrilling interpretation of the dramatic realities of the times and a re-imagining of what wartime must have been like for one of literature's most famous and compelling characters, a story of all-consuming passion and ambition set in war torn Scotland. *1hr 53 mins.
