In May 1940, Germany advanced into France, trapping Allied troops on the beaches of Dunkirk. Under air and ground cover from British and French forces, troops were slowly and methodically evacuated from the beach using every serviceable naval and civilian vessel that could be found. As Victoria questions the constrictions of her long-held position, the two forge an unlikely and devoted alliance that her household and inner circle try to destroy. The film tells the story of Pakistan-born aspiring comedian Kumail, who connects with grad student Emily after one of his stand-up sets. However, what they thought would be just a one-night stand blossoms into the real thing, which complicates the life that is expected of Kumail by his traditional Muslim parents. When Emily is beset with a mystery illness, it forces Kumail to navigate the medical crisis with her parents, while dealing with the emotional tug-of-war between his family and his heart. *2hr, 15. Ireland 1919: workers unite to form volunteer guerrilla armies to face the ruthless 'Black and Tan' squads. Driven by a deep sense of duty and a love for his country, Damien abandons his career as a doctor and joins his brother, Teddy, in a dangerous and violent fight for freedom. As bold tactics bring the British to breaking point, both sides finally agree to a treaty to end the bloodshed. But, despite the apparent victory, civil war erupts and the families find themselves pitted against one another. *2hr 07min, 15. Stars: Cillian Murphy, Pádraic Delaney, Liam Cunningham*

Moscow, 1953: when tyrannical dictator Joseph Stalin drops dead, his parasitic cronies square off in a frantic power struggle to be the next Soviet leader. Among the contenders are the dweeby Georgy Malenkov, the wily Nikita Khrushchev, and the sadistic secret police chief Lavrentiy Beria. But as they bumble, brawl, and backstab their way to the top, just who is running the government? The one-liners fly as fast as political fortunes fall in this uproarious, wickedly irreverent satire. *1hr 47min, 15. Stars: Steve Buscemi, Simon Russell Beale, Jeffrey Tambor*

After months have passed without a culprit in her daughter's murder case, Mildred Hayes makes a bold move, painting three signs leading into her town with a controversial message directed at William Willoughby, the town's chief of police. When his second-in-command Officer Dixon, an immature mother's boy with a penchant for violence, gets involved, the battle between Mildred and Ebbing's law enforcement is only exacerbated. *1hr 55min, 15. Stars: Frances McDormand, Woody Harrelson, Sam Rockwell*

March, 1918. C-company arrives to take its turn in the front-line trenches of northern France, led by the war-weary Captain Stanhope. With a German offensive imminently approaching, the officers and their cook use food and the memories of their lives before the war to distract themselves, while Stanhope soaks his fear in whisky. A young officer, Raleigh, arrives fresh out of training. Each man is trapped, the days ticking by, the tension rising and the attack drawing ever closer. *1hr 47min, 12A. Stars: Paul Bettany, Sam Claflin, Stephen Graham*
